Alabaster Mobile Clinic is a non-profit, charitable healthcare organization based in California, which provides health services and health education to unreached, impoverished rural and urban communities internationally, primarily in Africa and South Asia. Alabaster consists of volunteer doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, and other healthcare professionals whose mission is to serve those most in need. Alabaster enters a community, whether it is a slum or tribal dwelling, to meet primary health care needs, treating both acute and chronic illnesses, and disseminating health education.

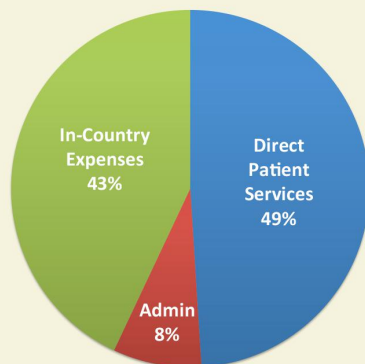

2014 Accomplishments

January 2014: Alabaster receives monetary donations from American Endowment Foundation and Benevity.

April 2014: Shannon Fernando-Rubera, Founder begins speaking engagements at various Rotary International meetings

May 2014: Alabaster participates in Providence St. Joseph Medical Center's annual nursing fair in Burbank, CA. Alabaster is endorsed by Glendale Sunrise Rotary International and receives their funding to purchase a car-powered vaccine cooler and vaccinations

June 2014: Alabaster is chosen by 5 Fold Marketing to receive monetary support via its first philanthropic social media campaign. 5 Fold also launches Alabaster's first promotional video.

August 2014: Alabaster conducts its third annual trip to Kenya, caring for 1,375 men, women, and children and administering 500 vaccinations. Three rural clinics are stocked with medications and Alabaster partners with Kenya's Ministry of Health to conduct its first joint medical campaign in Meru.

Health Trainings Conducted:

Endoynolasho School, Masaailand: Malaria symptoms, RICE (rest, ice, compression, elevation) for sprains, Basic first aid, Trachoma prevention – SAFE (surgery, antibiotics, facial cleanliness, environmental change)

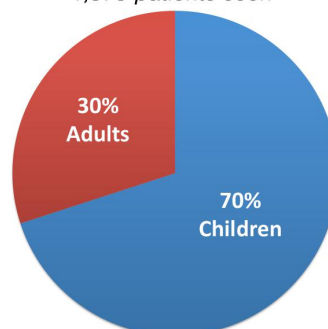
Ushirika Children Center, Kibera: First Aid, RICE, Basic Nutrition, Benefits of Exercise, STD prevention
