Alabaster Mobile Clinic is a non-profit, charitable healthcare organization based in California, which provides health services and health education to unreached, impoverished rural and urban communities internationally, primarily in Africa and South Asia. Alabaster consists of volunteer doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, and other healthcare professionals whose mission is to serve those most in need. Alabaster enters a community, whether it is a slum or tribal dwelling, to meet primary health care needs, treating both acute and chronic illnesses, and disseminating health education.

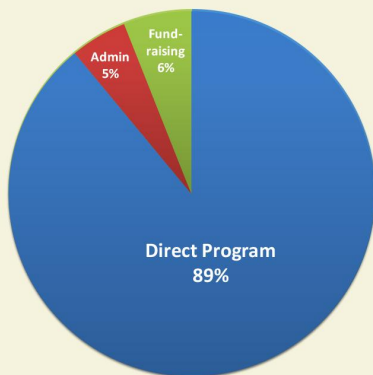

## 2015 Accomplishments

**January 2015:** Alabaster begins fundraising for Endoynolasho Clinic build

**April 2015:** Ground is broken in Endoynolasho for clinic

**May 2015:** Main external structure of Endoynolasho Clinic is completed

**June 2015:** Vision Christian Fellowship Children's Ministry holds fundraiser, \$4000 raised for Endoynolasho Clinic build

Alabaster holds dinner fundraiser, \$4000 raised, enabling the purchase of solar panels and lighting for Endoynolasho Clinic.

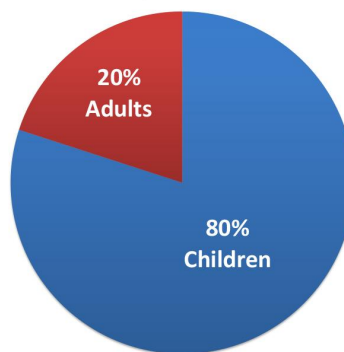
**July 2015:** Endoynolasho Clinic officially launched, in partnership with Girl Child Network, Endoynolasho Community and Conslog Engineering. Clinic opening ceremony attended by over 800 community members and by parliament member, Honorable Moses Sakuda. Clinic begins operations as first aid station and health library for Endoynolasho School students.

**August 2015:** Alabaster inducts seventh board member, Betsy Stewart

**September 2015:** Support letter received from the office of Honorable Moses Sakuda, pledging to drill borehole/pipeline to provide running water for Endoynolasho Clinic and Endoynolasho community.

**December 2015:** Male and Female pit latrines are built for Endoynolasho Clinic, in partnership with Girl Child Network
