Alabaster Mobile Clinic is a non-profit, charitable healthcare organization based in California, which provides health services and health education to unreached, impoverished rural and urban communities internationally, primarily in Africa and South Asia. Alabaster consists of volunteer doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, and other healthcare professionals whose mission is to serve those most in need. Alabaster enters a community, whether it is a slum or tribal dwelling, to meet primary health care needs, treating both acute and chronic illnesses, and disseminating health education.

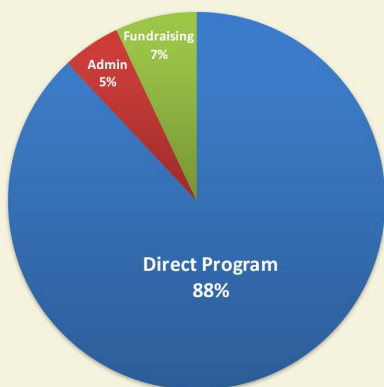

2016 Accomplishments

January 2016: Alabaster begins fundraising for rainwater harvesting facility (water tank) and filling of tank with clean drinking water for Endonyolasho community.

February 2016: Endonyolasho Clinic becomes operational through cooperation with the Endonyolasho Community, Shompole Dispensary health workers and county government officials.

May 2016: Alabaster expands programming to include photography project with students in Kenya. Begins digital camera drive.

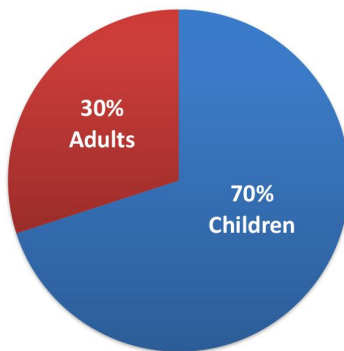
June 2016: Vision Christian Fellowship and Alabaster host a joint fundraiser, raising over \$4000 toward the construction of Endonyolasho's water tank and the purchase of 10,000L of clean drinking water for the community. | *Kenya Dreaming*, first ever documentary created about Alabaster's work, filmed and directed by Frederick-James Koch, is premiered at Vision Christian Fellowship, Pasadena, CA.

July 2016: Rainwater harvesting facility is completed for Endonyolasho. | Alabaster's 2016 team arrives in Kenya, witnesses first filling of water tank with 10,000L of clean drinking water for the Endonyolasho community. | *Kenya Dreaming* is premiered in Kenya for the Endonyolasho elders and school children. | Photography clubs created in the Endonyolasho School and Light Rays School in Nairobi. | 200 children immunized against typhoid fever in Mukuru informal settlement in Nairobi.

October 2016: Alabaster hosts *Called By a New Name: Portraits and Still Lives by Students in Kenya's Distant Places*, A Pop Up Photo Exhibit, at Found Coffee, Pasadena, CA. Photos taken by Kenyan students are featured and *Kenya Dreaming: Phase 2*, filmed and directed by Frederick-James Koch, featuring the water project in Endonyolasho, is premiered.

November 2016: Alabaster hosts *Called by A New Name: Photo Exhibit and Gala*. Over \$2000 raised toward 2017 vaccination campaigns in Nairobi and the funding of a motorbike for the Endonyolasho Clinic to serve as transportation for health workers and also as an ambulance to transport patients to the nearest hospital for emergency care.
