Alabaster Mobile Clinic is a non-profit, charitable healthcare organization based in California, which provides health services and health education to unreached, impoverished rural and urban communities internationally, primarily in Africa and South Asia. Alabaster consists of volunteer doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, and other healthcare professionals whose mission is to serve those most in need. Alabaster enters a community, whether it is a slum or tribal dwelling, to meet primary health care needs, treating both acute and chronic illnesses, and disseminating health education.

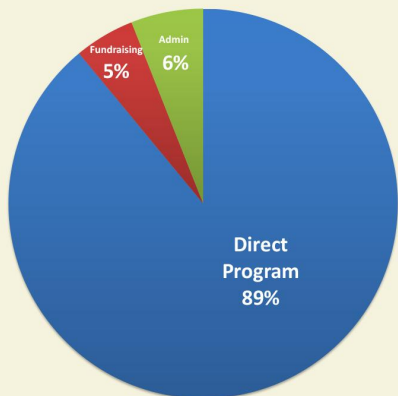

2017 Accomplishments

January 2017: Alabaster is chosen as a feature non-profit by Hollywood Swag Bag to be included in the Four Seasons Hotel Gift Bag honoring the Golden Globe Weekend and SAG Awards Weekend.

February 2017: Ambu-bike is purchased for the Endonyolasho Clinic

Alabaster is chosen as a feature non-profit by Hollywood Swag Bag to be included in the Four Seasons Hotel Gift Bag honoring the Grammy Awards Weekend and Academy Awards Weekend.

April 2017: Ambu-Bike ceremony is held in Endonyolasho and motorbike handed over to the community and health worker. The ceremony is attended by Kenya Ministry of Health officials and commitment is made to send local health worker to the Endonyolasho Clinic weekly.

May 2017: Build Hope Campaign is launched to begin fundraising for Phase III of Endonyolasho project: the build of a medical worker staff house allowing 24/7 presence of a health worker for the Endonyolasho Clinic and community and the construction of a maternity room, enabling the safe delivery of children in the Endonyolasho Clinic

July 2017: Alabaster 2017 team travels to Kenya. The Endonyolasho Clinic with completed maternity room is officially handed over to the Kenya Ministry of Health, given MFL code: 22487 and name: Endonyolasho Dispensary. The water tank for the clinic is painted white, to prevent sun damage. 200 Typhoid vaccines are administered to children in informal settlements in Nairobi

September 2017: The medical worker staff house for the Endonyolasho Clinic is completed

December 2017: Alabaster funds 10,000L water delivery for the Endonyolasho Clinic water tank
